Dear Mr. Carillo:

I am in receipt of a Petition filed by Sandoval County Sheriff Deputies Association seeking decertification of New Mexico Coalition of Public Safety Officers Association as the exclusive collective bargaining representatives for a group of Sheriff's Department employees. My preliminary review of the petition indicates that the Petition is insufficient in the following respects:

NMSA 1978 §10-7E-16(A) provides:

"A member of a labor organization or the labor organization itself may initiate decertification of a labor organization as the exclusive representative if thirty percent of the public employees in the appropriate bargaining unit make a written request to the board or local board for a decertification election..." (Emphasis added.

The Petitioner in this case is Sandoval County Sheriff Deputies Association, which is neither a "member of a labor organization" or the labor organization that is the exclusive representative itself, i.e. NMCPSO. Furthermore, an assertion in the Petition that a vote of no confidence was conducted is not sufficient to meet the requirement that at least thirty percent of the employees in the bargaining unit make a written request to the board for a decertification election. The Board has prepared a Decertification Interest Card, PELRB Form #17, available on our website, containing language calculated to meet the requirement of this section, to be used as an aid to those seeking to decertify their union.

Furthermore, according to Article XLIV of the copy of the CBA attached to the Petition, the Contract between NMCPSO and Sandoval County has a term of February 25, 2022 to June 30, 2025. Pursuant to NMSA 1978 §10-7E-16(B):

"When there is a collective bargaining agreement in effect, a request for a decertification election shall be made to the board or local board *no earlier than ninety* days and no later than sixty days before the expiration of the collective bargaining agreement; provided, however, a request for an election may be filed at any time after the expiration of the third year of a collective bargaining agreement with a term of more than three years." (Emphasis added.)

Accordingly, the Petition is facially invalid and Petitioner has until **May 4, 2023** in which to cure the deficiencies or the Petition will be dismissed pursuant to NMAC 11.21.2.13(B). Although Petitioner may be able to amend the party bringing the Petition and the requisite showing of interest within that time, the fact that any such Petition would premature given the term of the exiting contract is another matter, and so I invite the Petitioner to provide any information that would make my application of NMSA 1978 §10-7E-16(B) incorrect within that same deadline.
